Feed My People (FMP) made significant strides to address increased food insecurity by strengthening infrastructure and deepening programming and partnerships.

Addressing Increased Need

Our collaboration with hunger-relief partners was pivotal in meeting the rising demand for food assistance. Ongoing inflation has strained many households, but through strategic partnerships and community support, we sustained and enhanced our relief efforts.

• Project FEED: A Youth Hunger Initiative

This year marked the launch of Project FEED (Food, Equity, Education, and Dignity), our youth hunger initiative aimed at creating equitable access to food for all youth in our service area. Project FEED made significant strides against childhood hunger:

- Strengthened the impact of our current youth-focused food programs
- Expanded our school market programming into more school districts, ensuring more students have reliable access to nutritious food
- Increased special distributions to address service gaps during school breaks.
- **Completed our Hunger Action Center addition** to Feed My People's distribution center. This new space significantly increased capacity to deliver essential services and programs, including:
 - An evening pop-up distribution adapted to working family schedules
 - Enhanced programming space to host a wider range of community-focused activities and support services.

FMP remains committed to serving children, families, and seniors experiencing food insecurity in West Central Wisconsin.
