Feed My People Food Bank (FMP) moved to create and support sustainable programming and food procurement to strengthen long-term hunger relief.

- Phased out of the emergency distribution model spurred on by the COVID-19 pandemic into
 a sustainable year-round pop-up distribution program serving the needs of Eau Claire and rural
 communities where needed most.
- Sought increased partnerships with other food banks and food suppliers across the
 nation due to a struggling supply chain and the effect of inflation. FMP also collaborated with
 Partnership for a Healthier America to use strategies to maintain inventory, especially fresh food
 such as produce and meat.
- Continued to expand outreach with school districts to move from limited models of weekend
 food to a school pantry model serving students and families, providing choice and expanding
 healthy options.
- Initiated plans to build a "Hunger Action Center" addition to the building to improve programming space and provide flexibility for future emergency needs.
- Celebrated the 40th anniversary of Feed My People, which was founded in 1982.

FMP remains committed to serving children, families, and seniors experiencing food insecurity in west central Wisconsin.
