At Feed My People Food Bank, we see the power of community in action every day. It's in the volunteers who pack boxes with care, the donors who give generously, and the neighbors who show up to support one another. In times of uncertainty, one thing remains clear—we need each other more than ever.

The past few years have tested our resilience. Families who never thought they would need help have found themselves in food pantry lines for the first time. Parents skip meals to make sure their children have enough. Seniors on fixed incomes struggle to afford groceries as costs rise. But through it all, our community has shown up—with open hearts and helping hands.

At Feed My People, we believe that collaboration strengthens communities. In March, we were deeply honored to receive the inaugural Friend of Human Services Award from the Eau Claire County Department of Human Services (ECCDHS), a recognition that speaks to the power of partnership in ensuring no one goes without food.

This award acknowledges FMP's steadfast commitment to providing nutritious food and essential resources to individuals and families in Eau Claire County. Our shared mission with ECCDHS has allowed us to reach those facing food insecurity with dignity and compassion, offering a helping hand when it is needed most.

The partnership between FMP and ECCDHS began in 2020, and since then the impact has been profound. By 2024, our collaboration had helped the pantry grow to serve approximately 1,381 members of the community. The Centralized Access Team at ECCDHS has witnessed firsthand the difference this program makes, from an elderly man moved to tears with gratitude to a child's joy upon receiving a small treat. These moments remind us why we do this work—because food is more than sustenance; it is hope, comfort, and connection.

We are humbled by the kind words shared during the award presentation, including one anonymous nomination that stated, "Feed My People is always there to support our citizens." This award belongs to our entire community—our dedicated staff, volunteers, partners, and supporters—who make this mission possible every day.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to ECCDHS for this recognition and for their unwavering dedication to serving those in need. Together, we will continue to build a stronger, healthier community for all. children," she said. "Without this, I worry we would be able to eat enough."

It's difficult to express how fortunate I feel to say "Hello! My name is Padraig Gallagher and I am the incoming Executive Director of Feed My People Food Bank." Ten years ago, I helped to deliver food to pantries in all fourteen of the counties Feed My People serves. I met volunteers at the doors to Trinity Lutheran in Eau Claire and the church steps of the pantry in Conrath. I gingerly maneuvered teetering pallets to the lower river side of the pantry in Prairie Farm and unloaded my full semi for the Neillsville Pop-Up Pantry at the Clark County Fairgrounds.
